Did you know, relocating to one of Scotland's major cities may be the perfect strategy to kickstart or advance your career in the Tech industry? According to recent statistics, Scotland's technology sector is fast becoming one of the strongest in the UK with 11,200 Tech companies contributing £6.5 billion to the Scotlish economy. A huge spike in start ups and rapid hiring plans have been major contributing factors to this surge in Technology growth in Scotland along with generous investment in many areas of digital technology.



With 100,000 people currently employed in the Digital & Technology industry across Scotland in 2021 and no sign of this growth decelerating, Scotland is quickly becoming one of the top tech hubs in the world. Digital technology is Scotland's fastest growing sector for inward investment with centres of excellence for collaboration across cyber security, global business games, software, IT, space, waste technology, and wastewater technology. This consistent growth is drawing in Technology talent from all over the UK, offering a wide range of opportunities for individuals to grow and develop their career in the industry. In addition to this, professionals in the Technology sector earn on average more money than any other UK city apart from London. The higher salaries, paired with a much lower cost of living, with Edinburgh on average 32% cheaper than London and Glasgow 39% cheaper, constitutes to a much higher level of disposable income for those living and working in Scotland's major cities, leaving you more to spend on yourself and on your family.

Post Pandemic Growth

Despite the challenging conditions faced by most of the world in 2020-2021 with the rise of the pandemic, Scotland's Technology industry has continued to excel, and it is not showing any signs of slowing down! Tech companies across Scotland's major cities are optimistic for 2022,

starting the year strong with several notable acquisitions, expansions and investment deals coming forward from the previous year. Statistics published by Dealroom at the end of 2021 revealed that Edinburgh alone saw **47 successful venture capital rounds** in the year, and a **record high number of promising start-ups** emerging from multiple Scottish cities.

Not only has the pandemic failed to affect the growth of the Tech industry in Scotland, but it has also provided a vast range of new opportunities. With the 'Work from Home' rule introduced in early 2020, Scotland saw 44% of its employed population switch to remote/home working (Office for National Statistics). As the world of office work became almost entirely remote, this led to a huge increase in demand for all things technology, including laptops, video call and chat applications, onboarding and training programs and virtual meeting rooms just to name a few!



Although life 'post pandemic' is somewhat back to normal, many believe that office jobs will never be the same again, with many companies adopting a hybrid working model, the need for technology to support virtual meetings, team chats and interviews has not diminished. One example of a Scottish Technology company taking full advantage of these work-life changes is Edinburgh based, PropTech start-up Desana. Desana hopes to capitalise on the 'post-Covid hybrid working boom' (Digit) with their flexible workspace platform, facilitating how companies manage their office spaces, by enabling employees to choose to work from company buildings or from its growing network of flexible workspace operators. They have recently successfully secured £2.9million in investment to accelerate their growth and continue to expand in post-pandemic life, and the reinvented version of office working, all over the world.


SCOTLAND'S MAJOR 'TECH HUBS'

1) Work/Life Balance


